Undocumented Student Success Week (Oct. 13-17)

Recognized throughout the California Community College system, SRJC was proud to participate in this recognition week. From “Know Your Rights” workshops, healing circles, and creative justice expressions, the SRJC community created a space for belonging and active support for undocumented students.



EOPS program hosted “Prieto”, a one-man show by Yosimar Reyes. Through spoken word, poetry, music, and visual art, Reyes shared his personal story of growing up in a mixed-status family in the South Bay. His performance offered a powerful reflection on immigration, family, and the impact of poverty and undocumented identity on his life.

Equity in Action: SRJC Recognized as 2025 Pathway Champion



Santa Rosa Junior College was recognized by the Campaign for College Opportunity as a [2025 pathway Champion of Transfer Equity](#), honored specifically for excellence in Black student success in transfer-level math. This distinction highlights colleges with the highest percentage of Black students completing transfer-level math within one year of enrollment. I want to express my congratulations to the students, faculty, classified professionals, and administrators whose collective efforts ensure that SRJC continues to provide high-quality education.

Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT) National Leadership Congress: Reimagining Community College: Innovation for a Changing World

Together with Board President Chaaban and Zehra Sonkaynar, Executive Officer, Santa Rosa Junior College was at ACCT's national conference, where we presented “**From Day One: Reimagining Trustee Orientation for Innovative and Inclusive Governance.**” The presentation highlighted SRJC's redesigned trustee onboarding program, which emphasizes relationship-building, data-informed decision-making, and equity-centered leadership. Key components include cross-functional sessions led by executive experts, campus and community immersion experiences, ongoing mentoring and support for trustees (including the Student Trustee), and the integration of student success and personnel equity data into every module. The session also showcased SRJC's alignment with the Aspen Presidents and Trustees Collaborative framework, positioning the College as a statewide leader in innovation, inclusive governance, and strategic plan alignment. The presentation was well received, with several districts expressing interest in adapting SRJC's model to strengthen their own board development practices.
